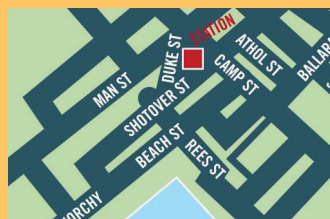
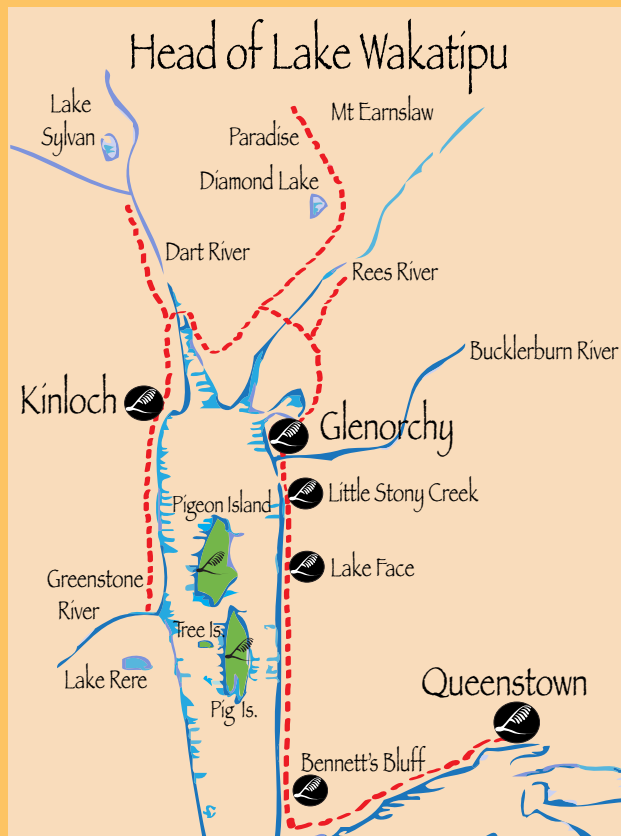

Pigeon & Pig Islands

The islands on Lake Wakatipu have played a significant part in this area's diverse history. They are now an important natural reserve surrounded by the breathtaking mountainous backdrop of the Southern Alps.

This safari launches from the shores near Glenorchy. A short paddle across the lake will take you to a secluded beach on either Pigeon or Pig Island.

DINNER ON SUNSET

At the head of Lake Wakatipu

You will find two small towns, Glenorchy and Kinloch, between the Humboldt and Richardson mountain ranges and separated by Lake Wakatipu. Earn your dinner with a short, quiet paddle from Glenorchy across Lake Wakatipu, past the Rees and Dart River confluences, to the historic Kinloch Lodge.

Allow 4.5 to 5 hours return.

Departs Glenorchy

- 7:00 pm.

Safaris operate between 1 December and 15 March.
