

Visitors to the Lake District should not miss a wonderful day out at Levens Hall and Gardens.

Situated only five minutes from Junction 36 of the M6, this magnificent Hall and Gardens, built around a 13th century pele tower, is the home of the Bagot family. Why not walk around the interior of the Hall to see the fine collection of Jacobean furniture and stunning paintings, as well as examples of the earliest English patchwork and beautiful Cordova leather wall coverings? Our knowledgeable House Stewards will be on-hand to answer questions.

The world-famous award-winning topiary gardens were laid out in the 1690s by Guillaume Beaumont, Gardener to King James II and Colonel James Grahme, and retain many of their original features. They are a delight to explore. Escorted Garden Walks take place at 2pm every Monday and Wednesday.

The Bellingham Buttery offers a delicious selection of homemade fayre whilst the Potting Shed Gift Shop sells a variety of unique gifts, cards and books. Look out for Levens's Morocco Ale too - legend has it that Colonel Grahme buried the secret recipe under the evergreens in the Garden during the Civil War.

Levens Deer Park is situated just across the road from the Hall and Gardens. If you have some time to spare, feel free to take a stroll along the marked footpaths and enjoy the stunning scenery and wildlife which includes black fallow deer, kingfishers and a herd of rare breed Bagot goats.
