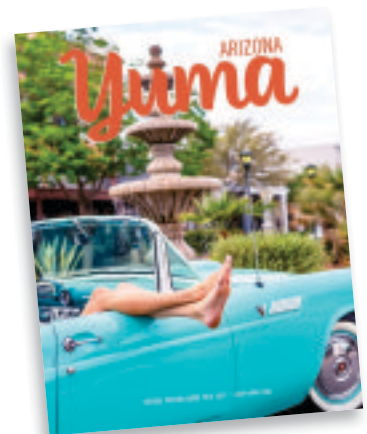

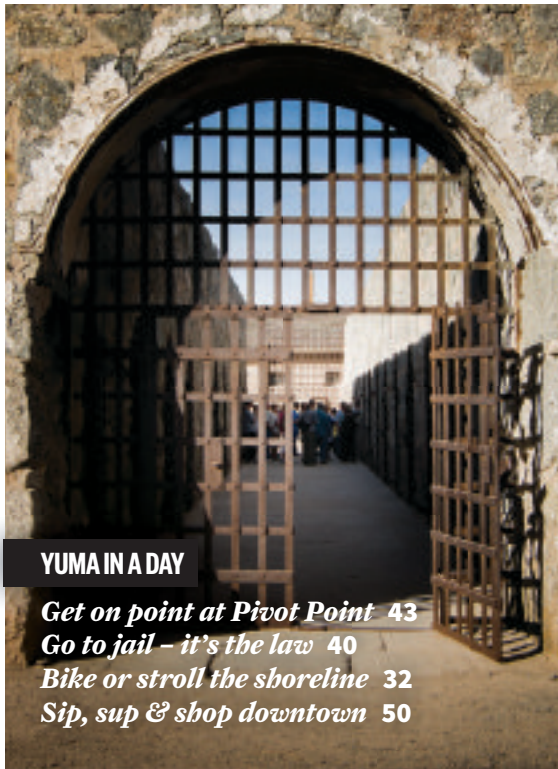

Where We Are

On the banks of the Colorado River, Yuma is tucked in Arizona's southwest corner, and shares borders with Mexico and California.* About halfway between San Diego and Phoenix and an easy drive from Los Angeles, Yuma's not just a great destination itself, it's on the way to many others.

**This Guide includes info about our California neighbors. Note it's an hour earlier across the river during the winter - California is in the Pacific time zone and observes daylight savings time, Arizona sticks with Mountain Standard time all year.*



Who We Are

Yuma is the largest city in and the county seat of Yuma County. About 94,000 Yumans strong, Yuma is Arizona's 11th largest city—but the biggest population center outside metro Phoenix and Tucson. Total county population is just over 204,000, and reflecting our border location, about 60 percent Hispanic. With the arrival of sun-seeking snowbirds, Yuma's population nearly doubles.



What We Do

Folks who think Yuma's just a dusty desert are surprised to learn farming is our top business. With rich soil, abundant water and more than 350 days of sunshine a year, Yuma enjoys one of the country's longest growing seasons and

GETTING HERE, GETTING AROUND

Many Yuma visitors arrive by car or RV: Interstate 8 runs east and west, and Highway 95 goes north to Interstate 10 and south to the Mexican border. American Airlines offers multiple flights daily (see airport sidebar), plus there's bus (Greyhound) and passenger rail service (Amtrak). SUNSHINE

Be sure to pack some sunscreen! According to Guinness World Records, Yuma is the sunniest place on earth, enjoying bright skies about 91 percent of daylight hours. This is also the country's driest and least humid city—but not the hottest, Miami wins that sweaty prize.

Catch Air

Yuma International Airport is one of just a few shared-use airfields in the nation, with runways and other facilities utilized in cooperation with Marine Corps Air Station Yuma.

That means infrastructure robust enough to welcome Air Force One (yes we have!) or any modern aircraft. In fact, with a main runway 13,000-plus feet long, Yuma served as an alternate landing site for the space shuttle. Our airport is not just "international" in name: chartered and private aircraft can clear Customs here, making it a discreet stop for camera-shy celebrities.

But even if you're not a star, Yuma International offers a small-town welcome that harkens back to a simpler era: shaded parking right outside, on-demand security screening, and no jammed concourses to navigate.



"What I love about 'flying Yuma' is that it takes 10 minutes to get to the airport, 10 minutes to get through security, and 10 minutes to board," says one local traveler. "With just 30 minutes air time to Phoenix, I can be on my way anywhere in an hour."

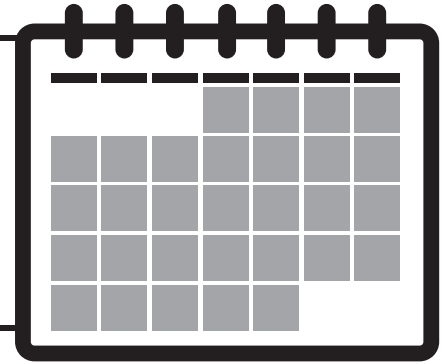

Some ways to get out on the water include:

Everyone loves a lazy float on a tube, especially on a hot day with a cold beverage. **Yuma River Tubing** (West Wetlands Park, 750.0247, YumaRiverTubing.com) will supply you with all the gear you need, and a ride up river — you just relax and take in the scenery while the current carries you back to where you started. Seasonal during hot weather.

New to kayaking, or to kayaking in this area? Sharon Tuttle of **Yuma Kayaks** (503.0537, YumaKayaks.com) offers paddling and self- or assisted-rescue instruction, kayak rentals, as well as paddle and picnic tours. Seasonal during cooler weather.

Organize your own river expedition by renting personal watercraft or a pontoon boat from **Jet Rent** (314.4345, Jet-Rent.com). All watercraft rentals include life jackets and a trailer; trucks to haul are also available. Year-round.

For a guided canoe or kayak trip down the mighty Colorado, contact **City Parks & Recreation** (373.5200). Requests must be made at least three weeks in advance, and the cost is \$20 per person with a minimum group size of 10 (participants must be six or older). Year-round. Please note, Parks and Rec also offers public trips throughout the year that anyone can sign up for.

FLOAT YOUR BOAT

There are miles of river to explore in the area, the main upstream access point being Martinez Lake. There you'll find **Fisher's Landing** (539.9495, FishersLandingResort.com), with a bar and restaurant, bait shop, fuel dock, convenience store and RV camping; and **Martinez Lake Resort** (783.9589, MartinezLake.com), with lodging, camping, marina and boat launch, along with a cantina and restaurant.

To find your way to Mittry Lake, Senator Wash, Ferguson Lake and more, dive into a river map at VisitYuma.com/water-sports.html or at the Visitor Information Center, 201 N. 4th Ave.

SAND BY ME



The Imperial dunes have plenty of space for quiet contemplation (left), motorized action (top) and even a glimpse of history (plank road remnant shown bottom).



YUMA IS THE PERFECT PLACE TO JUMP INTO AMERICA'S LARGEST SANDBOX — an expanse of inland dunes that cover more than 40 miles along the eastern edge of California's Imperial Valley, just 20 minutes west. More than a million visitors flock to **Imperial Sand Dunes National Recreation Area** every year to camp under the stars and play in more than 127,000 acres of wind-sculpted sand open for off-roading.

During peak season, only permitted vehicles are allowed in the recreation area (see permit info at right), but rangers allow quick stops without charge for a look or a photo. Gaze up at massive dunes up to 300 feet tall, or see a fragment of the 1915 plank road that helped early motorists cross the tricky terrain. From the plank road monument (south of the interstate near the west end of Grays Well Road), you can also glimpse the Mexican border fence that's designed to "float" on the sand.

You can also look into the wild and motorized sides of this sandy world from the Osborne Overlook on Highway 78, or explore the North Algodones Wilderness Area on foot or horseback (no motorized vehicles) without charge. Find parking and trail access at the watchable wildlife area along Glamis-Niland Road north of Highway 78.

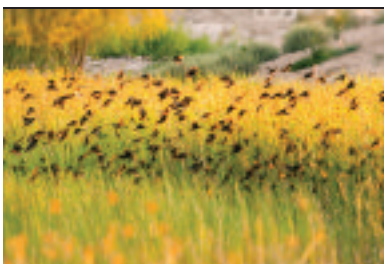


Grab your binoculars

It's not just snowbirds who flock to Yuma — nearly 400 species of birds and all kinds of wildlife live or visit here, from burros to beavers and bobcats.

Two prime spots for wildlife watching are located at either end of the riverfront trail (page 32). The rustic **East Wetlands** offers natural habitat for birds and critters, while **West Wetlands Park** is a prime birding spot with “people facilities” like restrooms, and playgrounds. Don't miss the hummingbird garden, with vegetation that naturally attracts the bright fliers.

Farther up the Colorado River, nearly 1,200 acres of invasive salt cedar between Laguna and Imperial dams have been replaced with marsh, riparian and upland habitat. Access more than nine miles of hiking trails at **Laguna Division Conservation Area** just south of Imperial Dam/Laguna Dam Road (take S24 from Bard Valley or head west at the “big guns” on U.S. 95).

GARDENS

For a walk on the less wild side, visit two in-town gardens. The University of Arizona **Moody Demonstration Garden** (2200 W. 28th St., 726.3904, FGCYuma.org/robert_j_moody.html) is a living catalog of trees and plants that thrive here. Seeded by the city, county and University of Arizona, this free garden grows thanks to volunteers and donations. Open daylight hours year round, group tours by appointment.

Cultivate your knowledge of native Sonoran Desert plants with a stroll through **Yuma Conservation Garden** (2520 E. 32nd St., west end of Fairgrounds parking, 317.1935, YumaConservationGarden.org). This 28-acre preserve also features a duck pond, antique farm machinery, tortoises, walking paths and an outdoor classroom. Open weekends November-April or by appointment, admission is free (donations welcome).

LACE UP YOUR BOOTS

You'll find lots of chances to stretch your legs in the world's sunniest destination.

If you're ready for a challenge, do what locals do and hike Telegraph Pass. To the top and back, it's just over four miles, but the farther you hike, the steeper it gets: total elevation gain is more than 1,200 feet. Your reward is sweeping views in every direction –

and adding your name to the book at the top.

There's no set trailhead: just follow the I-8 North Frontage Road east from Fortuna Boulevard until you can't go farther. Then start walking until you have to scramble like a mountain goat.

SLEEP UNDER THE STARS

Enjoy starry skies undimmed by light pollution by camping out in the desert.

In nearby California, overnight camping is permitted at Imperial Sand Dunes National Recreation Area (760.337.4400, [BLM.gov/ca/st/en/fo/elcentro/recreation/ohvs/isdra.html](https://www.blm.gov/ca/st/en/fo/elcentro/recreation/ohvs/isdra.html)) and at Picacho State Recreation Area in California (760.996.2963, [Parks.CA.gov/?page_id=641](https://parks.ca.gov/?page_id=641)).

In Arizona, you can camp overnight at Kofa National Wildlife Refuge (928.783.7861, [FWS.gov/refuge/kofa/](https://www.fws.gov/refuge/kofa/)) but not at our other wildlife refuges. No camping is allowed within ¼ mile of water sources, and vehicles must remain within 100 feet of the road.

You can also camp overnight in areas administered by the Bureau of Land Management, including Imperial Dam Recreation Area, Senator Wash, Squaw Lake (some services, fees apply) and Mittry Lake and Fortuna Pond (no services, no fees).

Get more info about these camping areas, as well as BLM's eight Long Term Visitor Areas around the region (seasonal recreation permit required but stays of more than 14 days are allowed) at BLM's Yuma Field Office (928.317.3200, 7341 E. 30th St., [BLM.gov/az/st/en/fo/yuma_field_office.html](https://www.blm.gov/az/st/en/fo/yuma_field_office.html)).

Pump up your tires

Yuma's multi-use trail system is great for easy cruising on a bike (see page 32). But for hard-core mountain bikers, there are some hair-raising single and double-track trails in the nearby hills, including a network in the Sugarloaf area (located about off Avenue 7E/Laguna Dam Road 3-4 miles north of Highway 95).

Maintained by local volunteers, these trails are unmarked, and even the easy ones have gnarly sections. For maps and tips, check out MTBProject.com/directory/8007023/Yuma, where riders have rounded up maps and tips for a whole list of featured rides.*

Want to hit the road with some company? Foothills Bike Club (FoothillsBicycleClub.org) organizes group road rides, more frequently in cooler months.

Fast-paced fun

Prospecting for motor sports action? Don't miss "the Diamond in the Desert," as Cocopah Speedway has become known since reopening under the ownership of the Cocopah Indian Tribe in 2010.

Located just seven miles south of Yuma on the edge of a mesa with spectacular views across the lush Yuma Valley, this 3/8-mile semi-banked dirt and clay oval has quickly earned a reputation as one of the top dirt tracks in the country.

It offers a full schedule of racing action from fall to spring in hobby stock, sport mod, stock car and modified divisions sanctioned by IMCA (International Motor Contest Association). Races draw a regular roster of drivers from across the Southwest and southern California as well as the local area, so you can root for your favorite for one night or across the whole season.

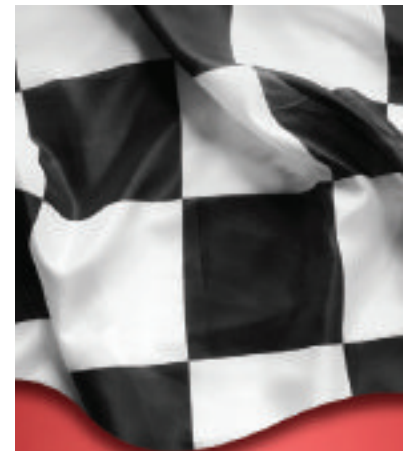
Special events also include ASCS (American Sprint Car Series) races featuring winged sprint cars. The full Speedway schedule and ticket information are available online.

With seating capacity for 4,000 in the concrete grandstand, plenty of free spectator parking, and a large pit area with racer store, you certainly won't feel crowded under the spacious skies.

"The speedway is a great place for a family night that won't break the bank," said one local fan. "Kids under 12 get in free, the concessions are real reasonable, and you can go into the pits and touch the cars and talk to the drivers after the races. My kids couldn't be more excited if they were at Daytona or Indianapolis."

Adding to the family appeal this year, the Speedway plans to offer some daytime racing action, and will also ramp up its Kids' Club, which is free for little racing fans.

AIM AS YOU PLEASE

Shooting sports are so popular here you can take aim indoors or out:

Adair Shooting Range is a public outdoor facility with pistol, archery, big bore, small bore, trap and skeet, police combat, silhouette and black powder ranges, along with a camping area. Maintained by Adair Ranges, Inc., a nonprofit comprised of area shooting clubs, it's off Highway 95 east of Yuma, about 3/4 mile past the Gila River bridge and is open seven days a week.

The indoor range at **Sprague's Sports**, 345 W. 32nd St., is open to the public and includes ten 25-yard lanes with automatic target retrieval. Firearms training classes are also available.

Be a (licensed) sport

With the Colorado River on our doorstep, Yuma offers world-class fishing for largemouth, smallmouth and striped bass, flathead and channel catfish, tilapia, crappie, mullet and bluegill. There's also great hunting here for mule deer, dove, quail and waterfowl.

Residents and visitors 10 and older need a license to fish or hunt, available at **Arizona Game and Fish** (9140 E. 28th St., 928.342.0091), at dealers statewide or online at AZGFD.gov. Short-term and combo licenses are also available. If you've

been a bona fide resident of Arizona for six months, you can get a lifetime license (hunting, fishing, combo and trout stamp) that's good even if you later move.

The September 1 opening of dove season is always a red-letter day here

Yuma is considered the dove hunting capital of the United States because grain fields provide food and cover for white-winged and mourning doves. Arizona Game and Fish estimates that over the last decade, hunters have bagged up to

1.3 million mourning doves annually, mostly in and around Yuma. Find detailed info to plan your hunt — including events, raffles, promotions and the 2nd Annual World Championship Dove Cook-off—at YumaDoveHunting.com.

Take a scenic spin or stroll

The Colorado River put Yuma on the map – and today, you can enjoy river vistas and explore local history along a paved, lighted multipurpose trail

Perfect for biking, hiking, “strolling” or even rollerblading, the main riverfront trail runs from Joe Henry Memorial Park (23rd Ave. & First St.) to Pacific Avenue/Avenue 2E. Check out these highlights along the way (keyed to map below):

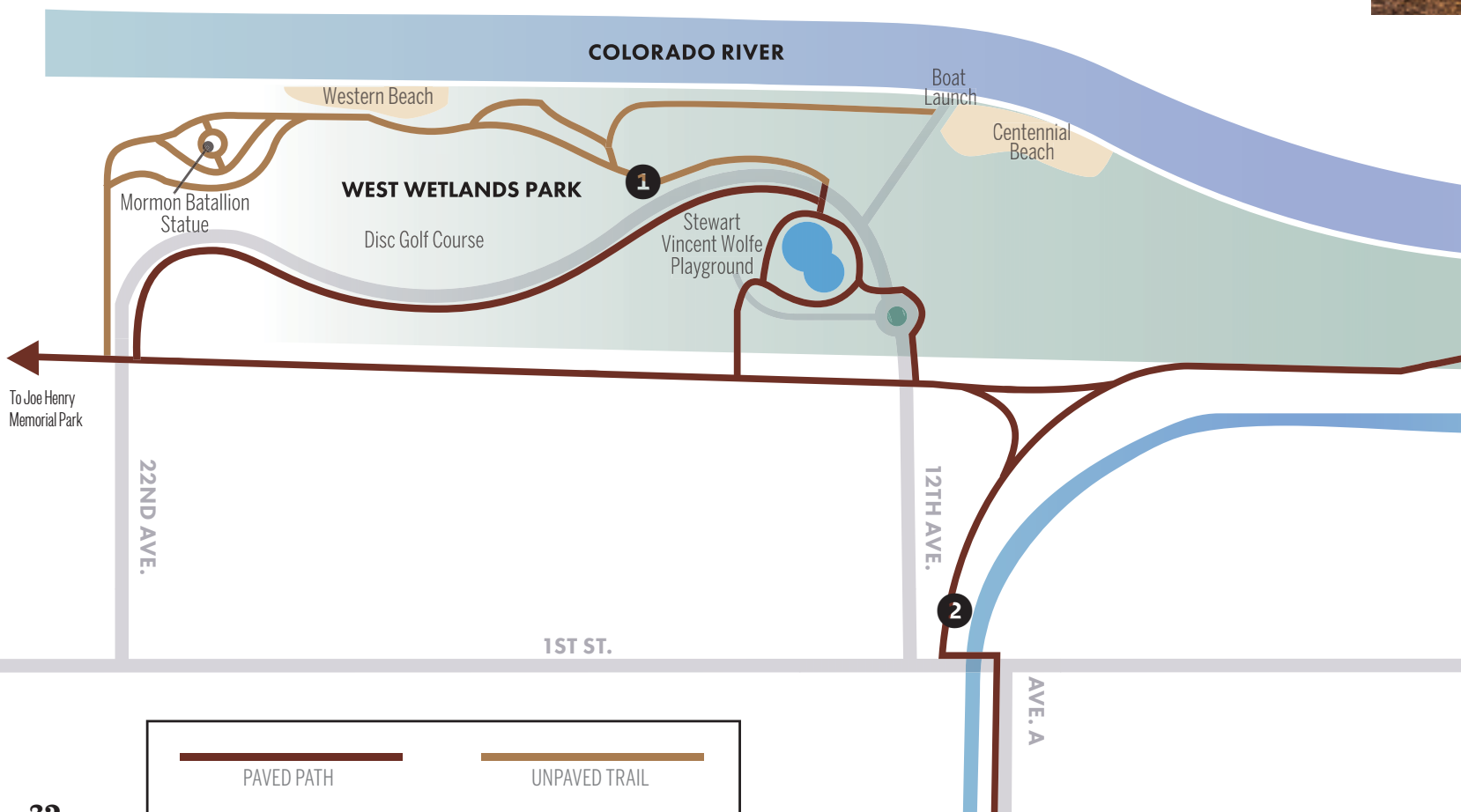
1 DETOUR INTO WEST WETLANDS PARK to view a statue commemorating the Mormon Battalion’s crossing of the Colorado on its epic 1846 march to California (on the river side of the main road, under an elevated iron footbridge.)

2 EXPLORE THE FIVE-MILE TRAIL EXTENSION along the East Main Canal to 40th Street. It branches off the riverfront trail west of the canal – cross over at 1st Street to continue along the east side.

3 PAUSE AT PIVOT POINT INTERPRETATIVE PLAZA (Madison Ave) for a capsule history lesson at the spot where the first railroad train entered Arizona in 1877. You can’t miss it – look for the locomotive!

4 JUST PAST THE OCEAN-TO-OCEAN BRIDGE, FOLLOW THE UNPAVED TRAIL about ½ mile to a raised overlook on the riverbank – or keep hiking to circle the East Wetlands on a three-mile rustic path.

5 FOR A BIRD’S-EYE WETLANDS VIEW, stick to the paved path along the levee all the way to Pacific Avenue/Avenue 2E – but keep an eye out, lots of bikers speed along this scenic stretch.





WAY TO ROLL

Need wheels? Rent bikes by the hour or day (a 24-hour period beginning at pickup time) at the Visitor Information Center at the Yuma Quartermaster Depot, 201 N. 4th Ave.

The rentals are 7-speed Electra Townie comfort models in women's and men's styles, and include helmets and locks. Bikes are owned and maintained by Mr. B's Bicycles – reserve and pay online, pick up and return at Visitor Information Center. Mr. B's also offers weekly rentals of road and mountain bikes at its Las Palmillas location, 1200 Castle Dome Ave.

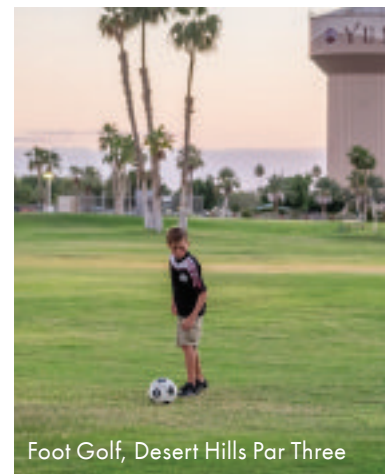

To work out or veg out JUST PARK IT

The City of Yuma devotes more than 600 acres to public fun, from playgrounds to riverside beaches. Here are some highlights — details at YumaAz.gov

CONQUER THE CASTLE

Kids consider the Stewart Vincent Wolfe Creative Playground at West Wetlands Park (282 N. 12th Ave.) one of Yuma's landmark attractions.

Better known as the “Castle Park” for its colorful towers, this ginormous playground was built by community volunteers with input from local children. It rose from the ashes after a disastrous fire “bigger, better and safer” with new fun features joining old favorites like the dragon slide.

There's even more to discover elsewhere at West Wetlands. Go fishing or watch remote-controlled sailboats at the pretty pond, picnic on the grass, flip out on disc golf, linger in the hummingbird garden, stroll through the Millennium Grove or hike along the river on a rustic trail.

GET ON TRACK

Want to get fit – or at least a little fitter? Get moving on the one-mile walking loop at Smucker Park (Avenue A & 28th Street). There are lots of folks who make this a daily routine, so find a buddy for extra encouragement.

New this year, seven fitness stations have been installed for a head-to-toe workout. Stops include pendulum abs and dip station; cross-country ski station; wheelchair-accessible vertical press station; wheelchair-accessible chest press station; wheelchair-accessible lat pull-down station; static combo sit-up, pull-up and dip station; and leg press station. Bonus: figuring out how to use all this equipment may improve your brain as well as your figure.

WET SET

Take a dip or just relax and watch the river flow at Gateway Park (259 N. Gila St). There's lots of grass plus a sandy beach, fishing piers and picnic areas – even an outdoor shower to rinse off before you head home.

You can also get your river on at Centennial Beach in West Wetlands Park (282 N. 12th Ave.), adjacent to the boat ramp. This expansive beach lacks ocean waves, but offers tons of sand for castle building.

Other cool spots include free water play areas at Friendship Park (1631 W. 34th Place) and Carver Park (5th Street and 13th Avenue). The push of a button starts the concrete critters squirting – great for toddlers, but fun for big kids, too. For info on city pools, see page 30.

BOARDER TOWN

Yuma’s skateboard park is located at Kennedy Memorial Park (23rd Street and Kennedy Lane). The original design featured a concrete bowl, two bank pipes, a half pipe, numerous grind rails and other structures; later additions include a half pipe, four bank ramps and a center obstacle.

Want to face off instead? There’s no ice in sight, but Kennedy is also home to an inline hockey rink and organized youth hockey league.

GET ON YOUR FEET

All thumbs when it comes to golf? Try your feet instead. Desert Hills Par Three Golf Course (1301 W. 32nd St.) has kicked off a FootGolf option on its front nine. You can play this fun variation on the traditional game with a regulation soccer ball and ordinary athletic shoes. No clubs required, just bring your feet and take aim at 21-inch diameter cups! Call 373.5220 for more info on hours and rules.

GOOD TO KNOW All city parks are open from sunrise to 11 p.m. Alcohol is prohibited in certain parks, and allowed in others only by permit (nominal fee). For more info, call 373.5200 or go to YumaAZ.gov.



CLASS ACT

The Parks and Recreation Department offers a wide variety of arts and recreational activities, sports leagues and classes for residents and visitors of all ages all year. Pick up an activities guide at the parks office at City Hall (1 City Plaza) or find it online at YumaAZ.gov.



FIESTA FACT

Most park picnic shelters — we call them ramadas — come with piñata hangers as standard equipment. Say ole and reserve one for your next party!

Kids of all ages can keep their cool from spring through fall at **Waylon's Water World** (4446 E. County 10th St., 726.6000, WaylonsWaterWorld.com). This family-owned and operated water park features a winding lazy river, 15

water slides and tubes that range from mild to wild and a ginormous water play area – plus a special (and separately filtered) splash pool just for the littlest merbabies.

Cozy up to a camel

Enjoy an “only in Yuma” desert adventure by getting up close and personal with a real Arabian camel at **Wild World Zoo & Camel Farm** (15672 S. Avenue 1E, 627.7511). This family-run business is a working farm that specializes in breeding exotic animals where you can meet, pet and feed camels, along with more than 200 animals of other species.

FROM ITS OUTSIZED REPUTATION, it's hard to believe that Yuma Territorial Prison only operated for 33 years. But since those years spanned the legendary era of the Old West, it's not surprising that movies like *3:10 to Yuma* immortalized this grim lockup as one feared by even the worst desperadoes.

Surrounded by the Colorado & Gila rivers and the unforgiving desert, the prison opened in 1876 when the first prisoners were locked in cells they'd hacked from the granite hill with their own hands. Over the next three decades, the prison held 3,069 prisoners, including lady stage coach robber Pearl Hart and 28 other women.

Some say the prison is haunted and while no one was executed there, the remains of 111 prisoners still lie in the prison graveyard—watch and listen for special effects featuring spirits of those who might still be doing time.

Don't miss a new intro film in the museum, a walk through the cell block and a peek into the infamous "dark cell." Plus, take your own mug shot using the ingenious mirror that allowed guards to capture full-face and profile views in a single exposure.

The DeGuello Gunslingers stage skits most Saturdays and host re-enactment groups from across the Southwest for the "Gathering of the Gunfighters" showdown every January. Check out the Prison gift shop for unique souvenirs and more.

Yuma Territorial Prison thrives under local management with backing from the community and visitors. Thanks for your ongoing support!





ON THE WATER, ABOUT THE WATER

Yuma Quartermaster Depot State Historic Park

From this high ground on the banks of the Colorado River, a frontier Army depot supplied all the forts of the Southwest beginning in the 1860s. At the turn of the 20th century, the Bureau of Reclamation worked from here to tame the river, building the first dam on the Colorado and Yuma's irrigation infrastructure.

Don't miss the exhibit on the Yuma Siphon — a massive tunnel under the Colorado River that first delivered irrigation water to the Yuma Valley in 1912, and still operates today, right next to the park.

Newer exhibits explore the future of the Colorado River, the lifeblood of the whole Southwest, from a wall-sized graphic detailing where the water goes, to displays about water rights and realities. The Colorado River Research Library may be used by appointment.

Besides telling the story of the Colorado River, this 10-acre park features beautiful grassy grounds and some of Arizona's oldest buildings — perfect for groups and special events.

✦ Our free **Visitor Information Center** and **Yuman Interest Gifts & Souvenirs** shop are located here (same hours & phone). **Bike rentals** are available by the hour or day (24-hour period beginning with pickup time, see page 32).

✦ Pause for old-fashioned refreshments at the **Back In Time Pie Shoppe**, located in the historic adobe corral house. It's open Tuesday through Sunday from November to April. Drop by or call Eva at 323.2034 to schedule a tea party.

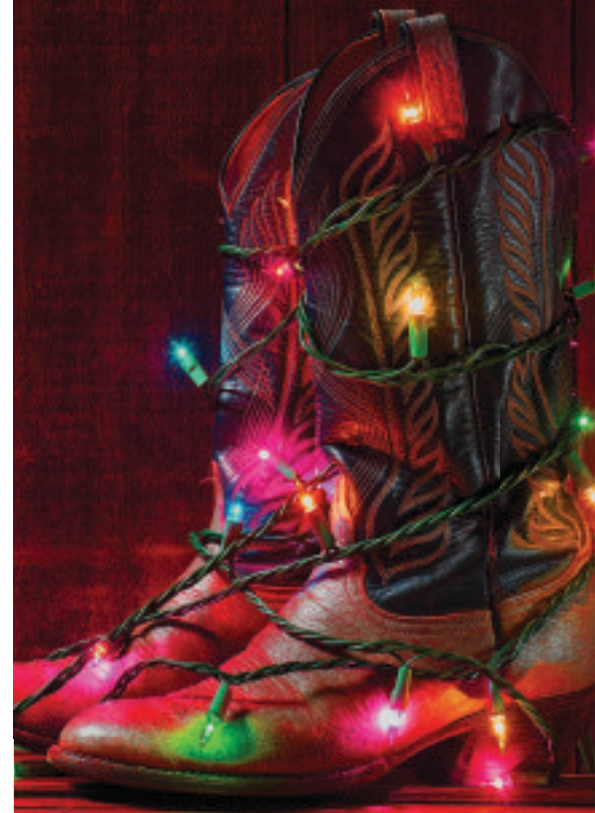

ENDURING FEAT

YUMANS FLEW NONSTOP FOR NEARLY 47 DAYS IN 1949

When World War II ended, so did military aviation in Yuma. To spark interest and revive the economy, local Jaycees came up with an idea to spotlight Yuma's perfect weather: set a record for non-stop flying.

An Aeronca Sedan named the "City of Yuma" took off on August 24, 1949, and didn't touch the ground again until October 10. The plane's record-setting 1,124 hours aloft were made possible by volunteers who passed food and fuel to pilots Woody Jongeward and Bob Woodhouse from a speeding convertible.

The original plane was located and returned to Yuma in 1997. It was restored and flew to mark the flight's 50th anniversary — now it hangs in the atrium of City Hall.

The first plane to land on Arizona soil touched down in Yuma on October 25, 1911. Robert G. "Bob" Fowler was flying a biplane with an engine rented from the Wright brothers from California to Miami. A monument marks the spot, along with a statue of Fowler. Don't miss photos highlighting Yuma aviation history at the nearby Yuma Landing Bar and Grill.

Mormon Battalion Statue

In 1846, the Mormon Battalion was tasked with finding a southern wagon route to California. Its record-setting, 2,000-mile march passed through Yuma because this was the best place to cross the river. The U.S.

Army of the West Mormon Battalion Foundation erected a bronze statue in 2007 to commemorate the historic journey. Find the statue on the river side of the main park road – look for an elevated iron footbridge.

McPhaul Bridge

Off Highway 95 at the Gila River

The McPhaul Bridge is an 800-foot suspension bridge built in 1929 and said to have served as a model for the Golden Gate. It became known as the “Bridge to Nowhere” when it was replaced by a concrete bridge in 1968 – long before the term had a negative political meaning. The bridge is closed to both vehicles and pedestrians, but you can take a free look at its graceful span by parking at From the Farm, 5158 S. Highway 95.

Museum of History in Granite And Center of the World Pyramid

A truly unique attraction, this ambitious outdoor museum aims to capture the whole history of mankind on artfully etched granite panels. There’s also a pyramid that marks the designated “Center of the World,”

a French-style chapel, a staircase from the Eiffel Tower, and a bistro and gift shop. Admission charge; open Thanksgiving through March, self-guided tours in the offseason on the “honor system.” Take I-8 west to Sidewinder Road (exit 164), then west on Center of the World Drive.

Pivot Point Interpretative Plaza

Learn more about the historic Yuma Crossing at the spot where the first railroad train entered Arizona in 1877. This public park incorporates the original concrete pivot that allowed Yuma’s railroad bridge to swing open for passing steamboats and features an authentic 1907 Baldwin locomotive. A “ghost train” audio installation re-creates the arrival of a steam locomotive.

Quechan Tribal Museum Gift Shop

Because their territory included the Yuma crossing, the Quechan Tribe has always been at the crossroads. The tribal museum is closed due

to structural concerns, but a gift shop featuring items made by tribal members remains open. Just across the Ocean-to-Ocean Bridge on Mission Hill, look for signs.

Sanguinetti House Museum

This charming adobe house with hidden gardens in the heart of historic Yuma was home to E.F. Sanguinetti, Yuma’s 19th century “merchant prince.” Permanent exhibits chronicle Sanguinetti’s life story, this year’s featured exhibit is “Secrets of Victorian Yuma.” Enter through Jack Mellon Mercantile, which offers unique treasures and books; walking & trolley tours of historic downtown also available, see page 19 for info.

St. Thomas Indian Mission

The present-day church was built in 1922 on the site of the mission founded by Father Garces in 1780. It’s not open for tours, but the church is part of the San Diego diocese, call for schedule of masses, other parish activities.



TEST CASE

YUMA PROVING GROUND FROM PATTON TO PRESENT

Military testing in Yuma dates back to 1943, when the Army established the Yuma Test Branch along the Colorado River near Imperial Dam. Because engineers could control water flows, it was an ideal place to test portable bridges. After the war, Yuma Test Branch remained in limited operation until 1950, reopening as Yuma Test Station a year later. Renamed Yuma Proving

Ground in 1963, this facility has since helped to develop and test combat vehicles, aircraft and many weapons systems.

YPG Heritage Center explores YPG's history and ongoing mission. Admission is free, call 328.3394 for hours and requirements for base entry (limited to U.S. and Canadian citizens except on escorted tours*).

SEMPER FLY

MARINE CORPS AIR STATION YUMA HAS A STORIED HISTORY



MCAS Yuma traces its roots to 1928, when Fly Field was established. The new airfield took off with a cross-country air race, and a year later hosted famed aviatrix Amelia Earhart and the first Women's Air Derby.

Permanent runways were OK'd in 1941, just in time for the U.S. entry into World War II. Fly Field then became Yuma Army Air Base, which graduated its first pilots in early 1943 and

remained one of the country's busiest flight schools throughout the war. In 1945, training ceased and the base was partially reclaimed by desert. But as the Cold War warmed up, the base was reactivated in 1951.

Assigned to the Marines in 1959, MCAS Yuma is now the Corps' busiest air station. Get a closer look at the biennial Yuma Airshow, info at YumaAirshow.com.

Discover hidden treasure

“THE COOLEST PLACE IN ARIZONA MOST FOLKS HAVE NEVER HEARD OF”*

One of Arizona’s hidden gems is just up the road – a visit to **Castle Dome Mines Museum** combines gritty history with spectacular desert vistas for a perfect day trip.

Don’t let the museum label fool you: this unique attraction is actually a ghostly mining camp sprawled across rocky desert at the foot of Castle Dome mountain. It includes a rustic town, more than 50 buildings stuffed with artifacts, a restored stamp mill, a self-guided hiking trail past mineshafts and graveyard, and coming soon, tours of the adjoining Hull Mine – all surrounded by the spectacular scenery of Kofa National Wildlife refuge.

There’s lots of history to mine: some of the diggings date to the 1600s, some were worked through the 1970s. But its heyday followed the discovery of a rich vein of silver in 1864, and during that era, more than 3,000 people lived in Castle Dome City, far more than in Yuma.

*“Wooden floors creak at my every step. A soft breeze rustles faded curtains. Tables are set with tin cutlery. Sun streams through wavy windows and splashes across bottles and glasses lining the wooden bar. Poker chips sit stacked, ready to be pushed into the pot at the next turn of the card. In every room, a moment hangs suspended. It feels like the townsfolk just stepped away, maybe to watch some hard-eyed stranger pull iron on one of the local badmen.”*

Today, you can get a sense of their hardscrabble frontier life thanks to Allen and Stephanie Armstrong, who purchased the Castle Dome claim in 1993, opened the museum in 1998, and have now incorporated it as a nonprofit. Their decades of equally hardscrabble work literally saved this chapter of Arizona history from disappearing – and preserved it for you to discover on a desert day trip.

GETTING THERE Take Highway 95 to Castle Dome Road (mile marker 55), then northeast about 10 miles. The first three miles are paved, the rest is graded gravel that’s navigable in a passenger car – take it slow and watch for signs.

TRIP TIP Take plenty of water and a packed lunch – the museum only offers limited drinks and snacks, but does have a picnic area for visitor use. Great for older kids, not childproofed for tykes.

OLÉ FOR THE DAY

VISITORS HEAD TO MEXICO FOR MORE THAN TACOS

Ahhhhh, vacation. Perfect for fun in the sun – and a trip to the dentist?

It's not an odd combination for tens of thousands who cross the border here as much for bargain dental care and eyeglasses as for local color.

Many head for Los Algodones (Baja California), a village just west of Yuma, or for San Luis Rio Colorado (Sonora), a much bigger city to the south. Both offer an array of dentists, opticians and pharmacies, along with souvenir vendors, restaurants and bars. San Luis Rio Colorado also is the gateway to "Yuma's beach" at El Golfo on the Sea of Cortez.

Since tourists are the focus, the currency of choice is the U.S. dollar and English is widely spoken. Most tourist businesses are an easy stroll from the border – and Canadians likely outnumber Mexicans on busy days.

GETTING YOUR SELF

BACK You need more than good looks to re-enter the U.S. from Mexico. Citizens of other

countries should bring their passports, U.S. citizens need a passport, passport card, enhanced drivers license or other approved document – details at GetYouHome.gov.

GETTING YOUR STUFF

BACK U.S. residents must declare purchases, even from a day trip. If you haven't used your exemption in 30 days, you may bring back \$800 worth of items, including a carton of cigarettes, 100 non-Cuban cigars and one liter of alcohol (if you're 21 or older). If you've shopped and crossed more recently, different rules apply – when in doubt, ask first.

As a matter of law, the U.S. bans "importation" of prescription drugs. As a practical matter, exceptions are usually made for "personal use" amounts of FDA-approved drugs (60- to 90-day supply). If your prescription contains a narcotic, you may need a prescription from a Mexican doctor to buy it AND one from a U.S. doctor to bring it across the border. For details, see FDA.gov or CBP.gov.

HISTORIC DOWNTOWN YUMA

MAIN ATTRACTION

Since it was at the end of the pioneer Gila Trail across Arizona, Main Street has always been the heart of Yuma. But proximity to the river also meant that downtown often flooded — and when it did, adobe bricks turned back into mud. After the last big flood in 1916, adobe construction was outlawed, and most of today's Main Street buildings date back to the 1920s.

To learn more, take a history tour on foot, aboard a trolley or even in the dark for a ghostly version (info on page 19). Tours begin

at **Sanguinetti House Museum** (240 S. Madison Ave., 782.1841) and include admission to the museum and gardens, plus this year's special "Secrets of Victorian Yuma" exhibit (info on page 43).

Downtown offers a wide variety of **shopping, dining and entertainment** — visit our YVB members (see map) as you explore the historic North End area.

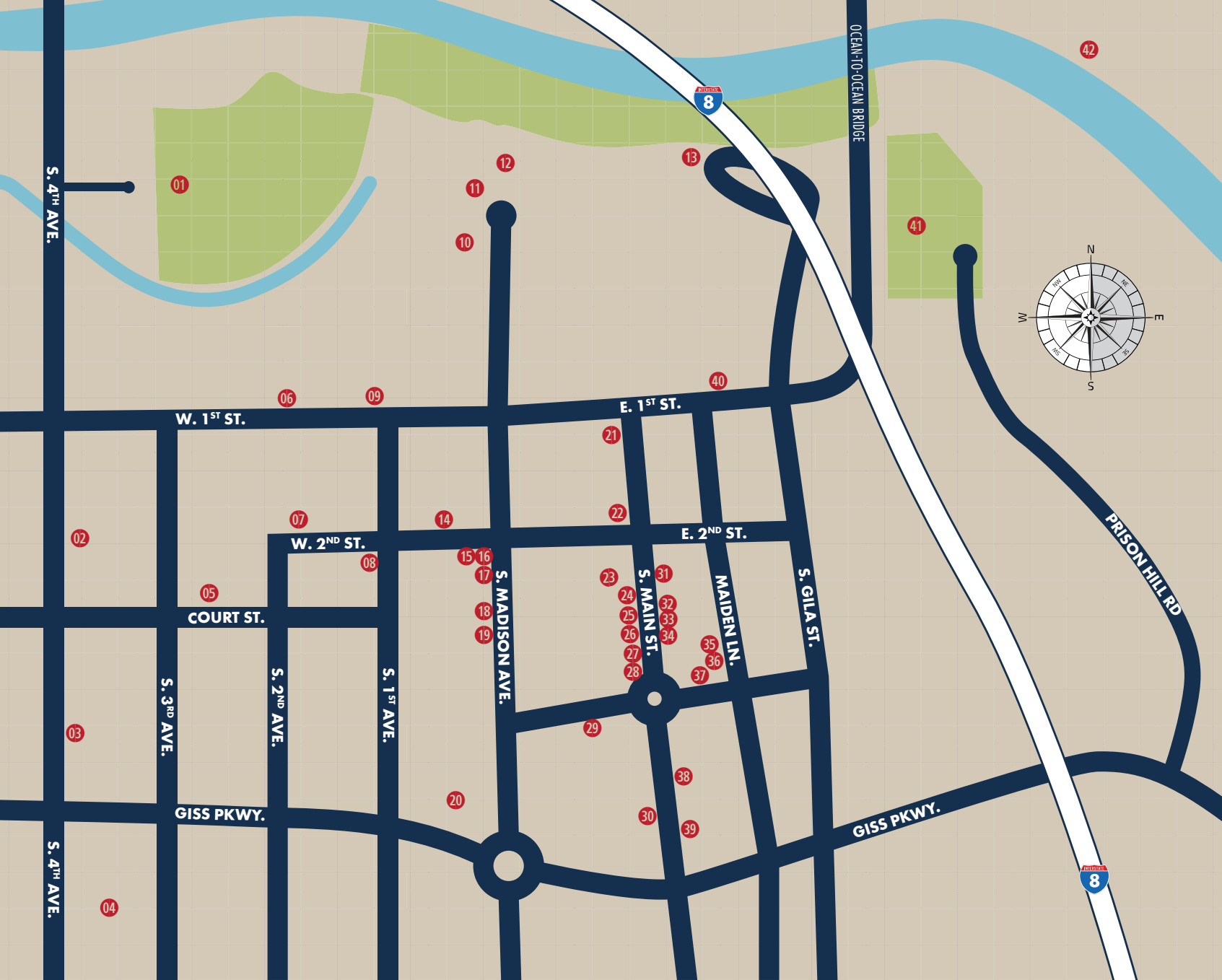
Don't miss the **Yuma Art Center** (254 S. Main St., 373.5202), with beautiful galleries where ever-changing exhibits

showcase work from local and nationally known artists. Yuma Art Center also offers classes for all ages, many in the restored United Building, where members of the **North End Artists Co-op** (NorthEndArtists.com) display work and do live demonstrations on Saturdays from September through May. The Yuma Art Center gift shop also features local artists and artisans.

The gem of the Yuma Art Center is the **Historic Yuma Theatre**, where you can enjoy both live shows

and films. Originally built in 1911 for vaudeville, the theatre is now restored to its 1936 movie-palace ambience — don't miss the original light fixtures, Art Deco murals and plaster bas-relief.

Main Street is also a perfect venue for old-fashioned festivals — check our calendar or call **Heritage Festivals** at 373.5028. A farmers' market Tuesdays through the winter benefits Crossroads Mission, call 425.941.5030 for information.

THE FOOTHILLS

The bustling area of Yuma now called the Foothills used to be known as "Hank's Folly."

That's because when Henry (Hank) Schechert proposed a development where people could live close to the desert back in the 1960s, Yumans doubted anyone would ever want to live "in the middle of nowhere."

They were proved wrong, as more than 10,000 residential lots have been sold since Schechert launched his first

subdivision at Foothills Boulevard and 40th Street.

Today this area is home to about 15,000 year-round residents and as many as 40,000 people at the peak of the winter season. Commercial development followed population growth, and you'll now find "destination" shopping, dining, recreational facilities and services (see map for YVB members) — even a shiny new branch library (13226 S. Frontage Road, 342.1640).

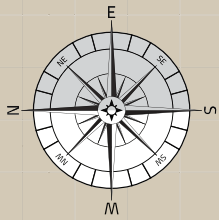
It's still easy to explore the desert along Fortuna Wash and the vast Barry M. Goldwater Air Force Range (free access permit required, contact Range Management Department at 269.2458), or try the popular trek up Telegraph Pass (see page 25).

Homegrown events include the annual Foothills Parade of Christmas Lights over three evenings in the weeks before Christmas, along with Mountain Shadows Artists Association's annual

art show at the library and its ARTrails tours of members' studios (see calendar at page 15 or go to MtnSAA.org).

And though Hank Schechert died in 1998 at the age of 82, his vision and legacy is still celebrated every February at Foothills Rotary's "Hank Days" parade, barbecue and car show, info at HankDays.com.
