Our work includes restoring derelict properties that are often gone beyond preservation in their present state. They are usually large scale projects commanding substantial time and financial commitments.

The apse roof of the Mortuary Chapel at Mount Saint Lawrence cemetery was completely restored in 2015



The Carrol Collection is an exhibition of important and significant military memorabilia and family heirlooms collected by five generations of the Carrol Family. It includes memorabilia from the Peninsular campaign, the Boer War and both World Wars and many unique family pieces.

The Collection was donated by June O'Carroll Robertson to Limerick Civic Trust and is housed at the Trust's headquarters in Bishops' Palace. This first permanent exhibition makes Bishops' Palace more attractive to visitors and plans are afoot to expand on this.

A new pathway along the Corbally side of the Canal Bank was created to provide a greatly enhanced outdoor facility for the local community.



Maintaining our cemeteries and ancient burial sites is ongoing. In Mount Saint Lawrence alone over 50 graves have been restored and repaired.
