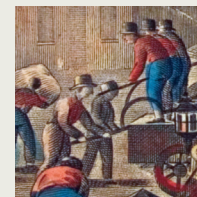

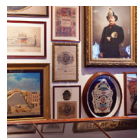

THE NEW YORK CITY FIRE MUSEUM



The Museum occupies a renovated 1904 Beaux-Arts triple bay firehouse originally built for Engine Company No. 30. The original sliding apparatus doors, brass sliding pole and iconic winding staircase highlight the building's former glory.

The Fire Museum displays and preserves historical artifacts of the FDNY and is considered one of world's most prominent collections of firefighting memorabilia. Permanent and temporary exhibitions document New York City's rich firefighting history, from the bucket brigades of New Amsterdam, the hand-pumpers of the volunteer era, the excitement of horse-drawn steam engines, to today's high-tech fire boats and rescue equipment.

FDNY WORLD TRADE CENTER MEMORIAL AND EXHIBIT



A permanent memorial is maintained to remember the 343 members of the New York City Fire Department who made the Supreme Sacrifice on September 11, 2001. This monument, erected in a sun-filled atrium, features the name, rank and photograph of each member. Lifesaving tools and gear, recovered from the World Trade Center Site, are displayed alongside. Featured among these relics is the leather helmet and bunker coat of WTC Victim #0001, FDNY Chaplain Mychal Judge.

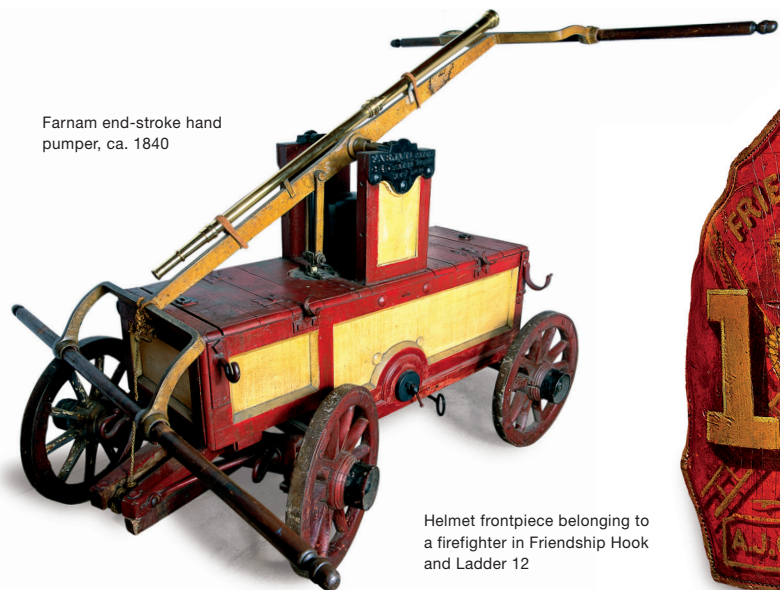
