



A trip to the 'Fair City' is not complete unless you visit: The **Guinness Storehouse**, the world's most famous brewery. **The Book of Kells** in **Trinity College**, a late ninth century literary masterpiece. **Kilmainham Jail**, opened in 1796 and closed in 1924.

DAY 2 On to Wicklow, the 'Garden of Ireland'. Visit Powerscourt Estate, Gardens & Waterfall listed in the top three gardens in the world by National Geographic. The monastic settlement of Glendalough, founded by St. Kevin in the 6th century.

DAY 3 We head to Kilkenny City dominated by Kilkenny Castle, built in the 13th century. St. Canice's Cathedral with its beautiful interior marble and stained glass and round tower. A visit to the Smithwick's Brewery is also highly recommended. Brewing the famous ale since 1710.

DAY 4 We head south to the city of **Cork**, the Republio's second biggest city. Visit the famous **English Market** to see culinary local traders at work and their fine produce. Then on to the town of **Cobh**, from where the Titanic made her final voyage. We will also take in the beautiful town of **Kinsale**, the culinary capital of Ireland. Of course, we have **Blarney Castle** and the world renowned **Blarney Stone** where you can get the 'gift of the gab'!

**DAY 5** Finally, we head back to **Dublin**. We'll stop off at the **Rock of Cashel** on route, an imposing group of medieval 12th and 13th century religious buildings. DAY6 We head back east and stop off at Clonmacnoise monastic site, founded in 544AD by St Ciarán. We might stop in Sean's Bar, Ireland's oldest pub for a pint of Guinness and then on to the Kilbeggan Distillery, the world's oldest licensed distillery dating back to 1757 and still exporting this famous whiskey all over the world.

DAY 7 Back in Dublin we'll bring you to the coastal village of **Howth** and **Howth Head** where you can savor a magnificent view over Dublin.
