



## Llanfwrog, Anglesey



Owned and run by the Williams Family, Penrhyn Bay Caravan Park is situated on the North West Coast of Anglesey, with marvellous views of Holyhead Harbour and the Skerries Lighthouse. The park has a large sandy beach to one side, sheltered coves offering safe bathing on the other side and miles and miles of Irish sea in front.

The caravan site comprises a touring area of 32 acres and there are pitches with or without electric hook up for touring caravans and tents. We also have seasonal pitches for static and touring caravans.

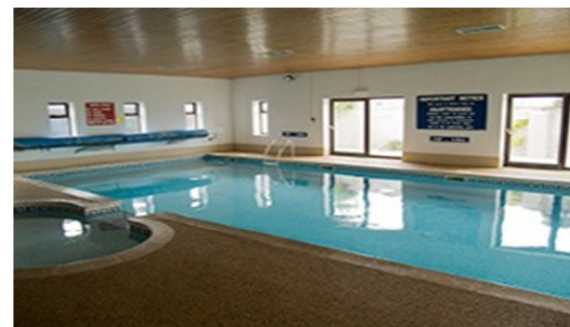
One of the major features of the park is its size, allowing space for everyone, room to fly kites or play football, cricket or just untangle fishing lines after a day's fishing at sea or on one of the local freshwater lakes.

For water sports enthusiasts, windsurfing, sailing and water-skiing are all popular activities. The park has its own sheltered slipway allowing the safe launching of all types of small craft.

## How to find us

Once on Anglesey follow the A55 towards Holyhead. Leave at Exit 3 signposted Y Fali/Valley. At this roundabout follow sign for Valley.

At Valley turn right at the traffic lights, signposted Amlwch A5025.



The road to Penrhyn is first on the left after the small village of Llanfachraeth. Follow signs from here through the farm down to the barrier gate of the Caravan Park & call for assistance.

Enter **LL65 4YG** into your SatNav and follow the signs for Penrhyn Bay Caravan Park.
