Weald with those of the Ouse Valley viaduct. The formal Garden features tranquil outdoor garden 'rooms', each planted with its own character and style.

The Garden Rooms

The Azalea Ring, Garden of Allah, Old Rhododendron Garden, Rose Garden, Italian Garden, Mid Summer Border and Long Dell offer something for everyone. This special garden has rare plants, 82 champion trees and exotic species which make a visit to Borde Hill an unforgettable experience.



Parkland & Woodland

Enjoy a woodland walk amongst the giant rhododendrons that overhang carpets of bluebells in the spring, take a lakeside stroll or picnic in the parkland. Dogs on leads are welcome.



Kids & Playground

There is endless fun for kids in the adventure playground with a zip wire, swings and climbing area as well as family picnic tables.

Children's trails during events encourage all the family to explore the garden and woodland.
