

# How to find us

Leighton Buzzard is an attractive Bedfordshire market town, some 40 miles (65km) north of London. The narrow-gauge railway station is at Page's Park, on the south side of the town.

#### By road

If you are tracking us on GPS, our postcode is LU7 4TG. From the A505/A4146 southern bypass, turn towards the town centre at the roundabout signed Narrow Gauge Railway, and follow the brown steam-train signs. Page's Park station is on the right, and all-weather parking is free of charge. From the M1, the new Junction 11A provides easy, fast access from London and its surroundings.

#### **By public transport**

Frequent trains operate to Leighton Buzzard main-line station from London Euston and Clapham Junction. From the north, there are direct services from Milton Keynes, Northampton, and stations to Birmingham.

Local bus D1 provides frequent connections from the main-line station, and other bus services in the town centre, to the Narrow Gauge Railway stop in Billington Road. This service does not run on Sundays and Bank Holidays.

#### Celebrating 50 years of narrow-gauge railway history - and Royal approval!

In the summer of 1968, a small group of volunteers began operating steam passenger trains over Leighton

Buzzard's private narrow-gauge railway. Until then, it had carried only sand from the local quarries.

Half a century on, these same volunteers, and their successors, have turned a semi-derelict mineral railway into one of England's leading narrow-gauge working museums.

The impressive new building at our Page's Park terminal station is one of the latest improvements to be completed successfully.

For these achievements, we are honoured to have been presented with the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service in 2017.

#### What's different about the Leighton Buzzard Railway?

- Rails that are 2 feet apart, less than half the size of mainline tracks. That makes everything smaller, but definitely not a toy.
- Trains that go round sharp bends, climb steep hills, amble alongside roads, and thread through modern housing estates, plus level crossings that hold up the traffic! The round trip typically takes 80 minutes.
- One of the largest and most diverse collections of narrowgauge locomotives on public display in England, as part of being an Accredited Museum.
- Free guided tours of the engine shed at Page's Park, getting up close to our collection of steam locomotives from all over the world.
- The Stonehenge Works Trail at our "country" terminus lets you discover the fascinating history of the railway's industrial past, and its links with the grim days of the First World War.
- If you have your smartphone on you when you visit, our free app will guide you around the station at Page's Park, and identify points of interest during the journey. Search for Heritage Railway Trails on the App Store or Google Play.

#### Bring a group

The Leighton Buzzard Railway is a destination with a difference for group outings of all types – from kids' birthdays to school trips and touring coach parties.



All pre-booked parties of nine people or more, travelling on public trains, receive free reserved seats, a named engine headboard, and a discounted fare. Also a free train ride and refreshments for coach drivers.

You can also hire exclusive private charter trains outside the public timetable, or book a VIP Footplate Experience for one or more people. Contact **traffic.mgr@lbngrs.org.uk** to discuss your requirements.

#### Eat, drink and shop

Page's Park station shop offers the best selection of Thomas books and toys for miles around, plus a good selection of other souvenir items.

Stonehenge Works has a Craft Shop, where you can browse through a fascinating collection of unique hand-crafted products, all made locally. It also sells light refreshments for your stopover.

And don't miss the newly refurbished 1940's themed Buzzrail Cafe at Page's Park station, for a great selection of meals and drinks.

#### A little extra help

Customers with disabilities have priority parking at Page's Park station, with unbroken ramp access through and on to their train. Accessible toilets are available at Page's Park. Advance booking by customers with disabilities will help us to help you.

For small children, changing facilities and high chairs are available. Buggies can be left in the Guard's compartment on the train, subject to available space. Well behaved pets are welcome – please don't leave them in the car on a hot day.
