### By car

Follow the signposts from the A9. The reserve is located 1.8 miles northeast of Dunkeld, just off the A923 Blairgowrie road. Free car parking is available at the visitor centre.

### By public transport

The nearest railway station is Dunkeld & Birnam. There are also bus stops in Dunkeld and in Birnam.

### On foot

Follow the Fungarth Path from Dunkeld which brings you to the reserve and visitor centre.

## Visitor information

 **LIVE VIDEO FOOTAGE** of ospreys and nesting birds.

 **KID'S ACTIVITY HIDE** 'Ducklings' Den'. Interactive displays, quizzes, games, viewing windows and spotter's board.

 **OBSERVATION WINDOW** with close-up views of red squirrels, great spotted woodpeckers and woodland birds.

 **VIEWING HIDES** overlooking the loch. See the osprey nest, water birds, fallow deer and maybe even otters!

 **WILDLIFE SHOP** packed with wildlife-themed gifts and toys. Hot and cold refreshments and snacks.

## Have a wild day out at our four-star visitor centre and wildlife reserve

The perfect opportunity for wildlife watching all year round. Our children's hide has a host of activities and our year-round events programme includes children's activities, optics fairs, photography workshops, wildlife trails and much more. Fun for all the family!



### Spring

Watch out for the arrival of spring migrants including swallows and sand martins. Listen for birdsong on our woodland trail as we approach nesting time.



### Summer

Witness the daily lives of our ospreys close up via our high definition camera and from our viewing hides. Watch them fishing on the loch.



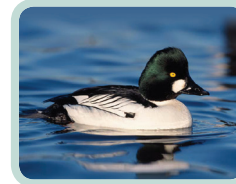
### Autumn

Watch red squirrels from only a couple of feet away as they gather hazelnuts to bury, in readiness for the colder months ahead.



### Winter

Wildfowl gathering in large numbers on the loch can easily be seen from our viewing hides using our telescopes and binoculars.
