Location: The Wairere Boulders are situated at the end of McDonnell Road near Horeke, 14 km off State Highway 1 (Rangiahua turnoff) and also 14 km off State Highway 12 (Taheke turnoff). Just follow the well visible road signs.

Walks in the valley are unguided, tracks are well visible and marked.

The **"Boulder Loop"** is an easy round stroll of **1 hour** and can be enjoyed by "young" and "old".

The **"Platform Track"** branches off from the "Boulder Loop" leading up to the platform with the grand view over the "Wairere Boulders". It takes **one** additional **hour**.

Fees: Adults: \$15.00, Children: \$ 5.00

Students: \$10.00 Kids under 6 free.

2 adults with children can use the "family-pass": \$ 35.00

Group discount available for schools and clubs.

Prices may be subject to change without notice.

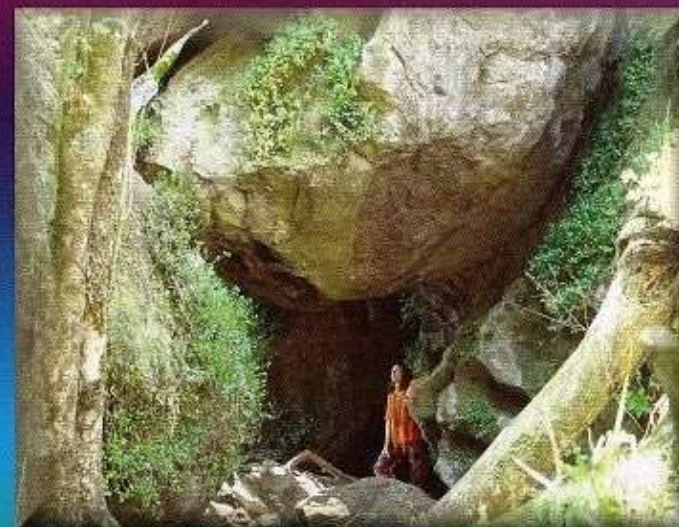
A) Visitors must wear good sensible walking shoes.
