Phare Ponleu Selpak or "The Brightness of the Arts" is a NGO located in Battambang, Cambodia that helps children from difficult backgrounds improve their lives through artistic trainings, educational programs, and social support.

Phare Ponleu Selpak's Story

Nine young Cambodians and their teacher founded the school.

In 1994, nine young Cambodians, with their teacher Veronique Decrop returned from the refugee camps in Thailand to create Phare Ponleu Selpak. These young men had spent their childhoods at the Site 2 refugee camp at the Thai border. In the camp, the French volunteer taught them to use art to cope with trauma. At the time many children in Battambang were living with trauma, poverty, and abuse. Phare Ponleu Selpak was created to help these children heal and rebuild



their society. To this end, the organization offered classes in visual arts performing arts, acadmic as well as social support.

Phare Ponleu Selpak Today

Today, Phare Ponleu Selpak has grown dramatically. The organization now revitalizing Cambodian arts and culture through performing and visual arts classes, education, and social support. Everyday these programs are provided to over 1200 students in Battambang and 800 families in 3 target communes receive social follow-ups by the organization.



EDUCATION

Education has been at the core of Phare Ponleu Selpak's mission since the beginning. Today, Phare Ponleu Selpak divides its education program into two parts:

Formal Programs

Academic School from Kindergarten to High School

Informal Programs

- Child Development Center
- Library
- Tutoring
- Computer Traning



SOCIAL SUPPORT

The Social Support Department of Phare Ponleu Selpak is dedicated to improving the standard of living for local children and their families.

Today, Phare Ponleu Selpak supports over 200 families directly and 800 indirectly through different programs.

Child Protection Program

In the Child Protection Program, our Social Support department identifies the children who are most in need of help.

Sponsorship Program

Generous international donors provide financial support to selected students. The collective sponsorship program PPSA provides these services to eligible children



SCHOOL OF VISUAL AND APPLIED ARTS

Phare Ponleu Selpak Association (PPSA) offers a Visual and Applied Art School in Battambang with the support of French co-funding partners AFD and CCFD.

The school provides students with professional training in graphic design, visual arts, and animation. This visual arts school in Battambang opens the door to employment opportunities in Cambodia's growing visual art field.



PERFORMING ARTS SCHOOL

The Performing Arts School of Phare Ponleu Selpak began with the music school in 1996. Today, the Performing Arts School contains the Circus, Theatre, Music and Dance departments.

PPSA welcomes all children and young adults regardless their social class, race, political orientation, nationality, or sexual orientation. We do put a special emphases on serving children who come from disadvantaged backgrounds involving poverty, neglect, violence, or trafficking. All the Performing Arts classes are free.

Phare Performing Social Enterprise has three goals:

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Create meaningful employment opportunities for Cambodian artists.

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Create financially sustainable social businesses that provide a reliable income streams for Phare Ponleu Selpak.

Revitalise the arts sector in Cambodia and promote Cambodian art locally and internationally




Phare Creative Studio

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PHARE PONLEU SELPAK

Phare Ponleu Selpak (PPS) is a not-for-profit Cambodian association that works with vulnerable children, young adults and their families through three fields of intervention: art training, social support and educational programs.

Phare Ponleu Selpak was created in 1994 by nine young Cambodians who returned to their country after spending their childhoods in the refugee camps at the Thai border.

These young people wanted to help to rebuild their country after many years of conflict, and so they created an organisation to support the children in their community. Many of these chidren were living in difficult situations, with histories of trauma, poverty and abuse. Through classes in visual and performing arts, along with social support, the organisation helped to reintegrate these children into society.

The artistic training offered at PPS has been found to aid concentration, communication and creative thinking skills, vastly improving the choices available to children as they reach adulthood.

Graduates from PPS arts schools promote Cambodian art and culture through national and international performances and exhibitions. Professional opportunities are provided by PPS' sister organisations: Phare, The Cambodian Circus and Phare Design Studios. In a country where the arts industry was destroyed through years of upheaval, these initiatives promote a renewed sense of Cambodian pride and identity.





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ຮູງງຸລຸລຣ Eclipse

How far would someone go to fight back against rejection and bullying? In a rural Cambodian village a disfigured young man is rejected and ridiculed. He wonders why he is cursed and seeks help from the gods. They answer his prayers by transforming him into a beautiful woman. Using this new form, he attracts the attention and desire of the village men. But the villagers quickly discover there's something sinister about the newcomer in their midst. Based on traditional Cambodian folktales, Eclipse is a story of rejection, revenge, spirit possession and eventual forgiveness set to original music and told through a dramatic mix of theater, Apsara dance and modern circus arts.





ສສູ້ຄວ Influence

Survival of the fittest. Domination. Manipulation. How do we create a place for ourselves in the world? Influence mixes drama, circus and puppetry to explore struggles for power and survival. From primordial organisms battling in pre-historic jungles to an ancient king being manipulated by external forces or a runner tripping his competitors to win a race; all seek to triumph. The characters of Influence dominate and are dominated, trick and are tricked, but ultimately discover their own strength and find unique place in the world.

Through a series of everyday situations, "Same Same But Different" explores the different habits and ways of living between Cambodians and foreign visitors. A sudden downpour, an unexpected power outage, a hectic boat trip and a relaxing dinner all provide the backdrops for funny encounters and opposing perspectives. But in every situation they find understanding and connect at a human level.

Sokha is a child haunted by war. Her memories of the Khmer Rouge combine with surreal visions to create a distorted and dark reality. But through circus she discovers her strength and finds the tools to heal both herself and her community. Based on the true life stories of the founders of

Phare Ponleu Selpak school, Sokha is a powerful mix of contemporary circus techniques, live painting, and original, live music. The show highlights the long term effects suffered by post-war victims and the way art provided a powerful way to heal and rebuild the country.

A mix of humour, drama, heart pounding live rock music and breathtaking acrobatics circus acts 'Khmer Metal' turns social convention on its head and gives the audience a glimpse of the wilder side of urban Cambodia.
