Car parking

Buses and Coaches

Coaches to Heathrow and Gatwick airports run every 20 minutes from Gloucester Green bus station on George Street. They also stop at Queen's Lane on the High Street. Coaches to London run every 15 minutes from Gloucester Green (and throughout Oxford). There are two services: the Oxford Tube (www.oxfordtube.com - for times and fares), and the X90 (www.oxfordbus.co.uk)

The Oxford Bus Company runs several local buses, taking you to places such as Woodstock and Blenheim Palace. Please check their website for more information (www.oxfordbus.co.uk).

Railway Station

About a 15 minute walk from Ship Street. Turn right onto Cornmarket, left onto George Street and straight over onto Hythe Bridge Street. Follow all the way down and the Station is on the right hand side. Check www.nationalrail.co.uk for times and fares.

Eating & Drinking

The Tower House has a sister restaurant,

Cafés

The Handle Bar – St Michaels Street Head to The Handle Bar for handcrafted artisan coffee. Used as the headquarters for many cycling groups.

Society Café - St Michaels Street New to Oxford with great coffee and a good supply of magazines.

The Missing Bean – Turl Street A tiny coffee shop, just down the road on Turl Street.

Pubs

Turf Tavern – Bath Place

A 13th century Ale house with large outdoor courtyards and frequent live music events. Choose from traditional, British pub classics for something to eat. Once frequented by Bill Clinton.

Duke of Cambridge – Little Clarendon Street Oxford's leading Cocktail Bar with great atmosphere and character.

Eagle and Child – 49 St Giles A traditional pub with a range of real ales and pub food. Home of the Inklings – C.S. Lewis, J.R.R. Tolkien, and Lewis Carroll. The White Horse – Broad Street A tiny pub with real ale and good fish and chips. Many episodes of Morse and Lewis have been filmed here.

Restaurants

Edamame – Holywell Road

A small, informal and authentic restaurant offering Japanese homecooking and sushi. Note the unusual opening hours. £15 per head.

Gee's – 61 Banbury Road

Mediterranean cuisine focused on the source and seasonality of local Oxfordshire produce. Dine in a beautiful glass house filled with trees and plants. $\pounds 20-\pounds 30$ per head.

Quod -92-94 High Street

A vibrant and contemporary brasserie, the Quod offers a mix of Italian and British cuisine, surrounded by a collection of young British Art. Parking is available. £20 per head.

Rickety Press – 67 Cranham Street, Jericho Known for its gastronomic quality, this relaxed and atmospheric glass-roofed restaurant/bar is suitable for many customers.
