

Friends of Salt Springs Park

Salt Springs Park is operated by the Friends of Salt Springs Park, Inc., a non-profit organization, in cooperation with the Pennsylvania Bureau of State Parks.

This 405-acre state park boasts a deep glacial gorge containing three magnificent waterfalls surrounded by a virgin hemlock forest.

The Friends own an additional 437 acres adjacent to the park's southern boundary and easily reached by park trails and Buckley Road.

This land offers expanded recreational opportunities and further protection to the Fall Brook watershed and its diverse habitats.

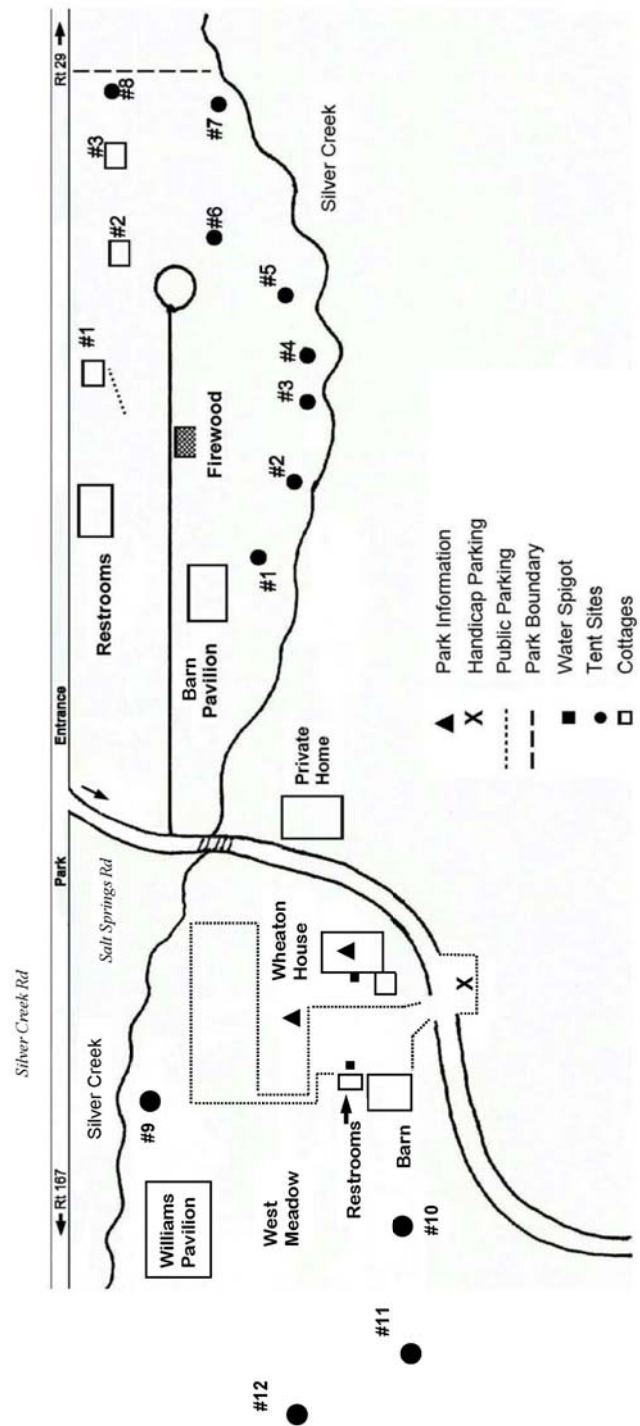
Over 15 miles of hiking trails wind through the combined acreage of the state park and the Friends land.

The Friends pay for operational, maintenance, and improvement costs through memberships, donations, and grants.

Facilities

Cottages

We have three rustic camping cottages. They have electricity, bunk beds with mattresses, porch, picnic table, and fire ring. They are *unheated*. Restrooms are nearby, and water can be obtained at the water spigot at the Wheaton House. Check in/out times: 3 pm.

Campsites

We have 12 tent sites. Each has a picnic table and a fire ring. Check in/out times: 3 pm.

Reservations

Cottages

Cottages must be reserved. Call (570) 967-7275 or arrange with staff at the Wheaton House.

Campsites

Campsites do not need to be reserved. Come to the park. Select a campsite. Go to the Wheaton House and pick up a Campsite Rental Envelope on the front porch. Fill out the information, insert your fee (in cash or check to "Friends of Salt Springs Park"), and deposit the envelope in the yellow strongbox at the side of the road by the Pavilion. Friends of Salt Springs Park volunteers will often be available to help you.

Camping Rules

- No alcohol is allowed.
- Pets must be on a leash at all times, and you must clean up after them.
- Outside visitors are permitted from 8 am to 9 pm. Quiet hours are between 9 pm and 8 am.
- Fires are permitted only in camp stoves or the fire rings provided. Please be careful. All fires must be extinguished before you leave.
- Cutting of standing trees and operation of saws are not permitted. Firewood can be purchased at the park.
- Maximum number of people per campsite is six.
- Please help keep the park clean and attractive. Dispose of trash in the park trash cans or take it home with you. *"Leave only your footprints."*

Parking

Parking is NOT ALLOWED on the grass or directly at campsites 1-8 or at Cottages 1 and 3. Be prepared to carry your provisions and to park in the public parking lot if available spots in the camping area are filled.
