TO BAROSSA VALLEY & RETURN

Single Day Tour

After winding our way through the suburbs and scenic Adelaide Hills for an hour, we stop at Gumeracha, home to the World's Largest Rocking Horse. It also boasts a café and Australia's only remaining wooden toy factory, we also can hand-feed the remarkably tame kangaroos, goats and alpacas.

In Williamstown, the gateway to the Barossa, we visit the astonishing Whispering Wall*. As tall as a 9-storey building and constructed in a perfect semi-circle over 110 years ago, it's possible to hear someone whisper from one end of the dam wall to the other end 140 metres away.

As the vine leaves replace the gum trees, we enter the largest and most celebrated wine region in Australia. Our first stop is the world-famous Jacob's Creek, the largest wine exporter in the valley. A local guide will provide an informative explanation of their wines and offer a selection of their famed shiraz, merlot and rosé for tasting. Our next stop, Kies, is a family-owned boutique winery, where the setting is quaint and the service is personal. Their exquisite wines are not available for sale anywhere else in the world.

For lunch we'll head to Saltrams for gourmet pizzas. You'll also get the chance to do a cellar door tour and taste a selection of their wines

After lunch we'll slowly make our way to Wolf Blass. This world renowned winery created in 1966 is nowadays one of the world's most awarded wine brands. We will get the chance to taste their wide range of wines before we pop into our last winery: Lambert Estate a family owned business that made their name thanks to their Chocolate port! Finally we'll stop by Menglers Hill lookout for superb view of the Barossa Valley before heading back to Adelaide, arriving at approximately 5pm.

From our comfortable bus you'll appreciate the fantastic coastal views as we head towards Kangaroo Island along the Fleurieu Peninsula. After driving for 90 minutes, we hop aboard the massive ferry for the 45 minute cruise to the picturesque beachside village of Penneshaw, where we stock up on supplies.

Our first stop is Prospect Hill, where a moderately easy climb offers magnificent 360-degree views of Australia's third-largest island.

The highlight for many is the guided tour along the pure-white beach of Seal Bay, where you can walk within metres of countless Australian Sea Lions snoozing on the sand or frolicking in the surf. Or maybe your favourite part will be the Flinders Chase National Park in the far west of the island, which hosts two extraordinary geological features: the Remarkable Rocks and the Admirals Arch, which is also home to a colony of New Zealand Fur Seals.

Our dormitory style accommodation is located within a farm on the edge of the national park. After dinner, we sit around the campfire swapping stories and maybe spotting wildlife, such as kangaroos and possums.

After breakfast our wildlife adventure continues! In the cooler morning weather, we can hike one of the many walking trails on the island where you can watch kangaroos hopping about the bush, koalas nesting in their favourite gum trees and possibly, spot a shy echidna shuffling past. In the summer months we spend some time swimming and snorkelling in search of the elusive leafy sea dragon which resides off the coast. You can laze about Vivonne Bay, Hanson Bay, Stokes Bay or one of the other superb beach spots with their pristine sand and clear water, or alternatively you can follow the nearby trail along the beach and river to search for more wildlife.

The action packed afternoon starts with sand-boarding down the Little Sahara dunes. We leisurely paddle with kayaks along the Harriet River, but if you do crave something more adventurous, quad-biking along rocky paths through dense scrub is an optional extra.

From Penneshaw, we reluctantly take the ferry to Cape Jervis for the short drive back to Adelaide to arrive at around 8:30pm.

DAY I We escape the city and cruise through the scenic Adelaide Hills with a morning stop to grab a bite to eat and a tea or coffee. We stop for lunch before entering Halls Gap, gateway to the famed Grampians National Park. We take an easy walk (40 minutes) to reach the amazing MacKenzie falls. At around dusk, when wildlife, such as wallabies, kangaroos, cockatoos and kookaburras, come out to play, we walk through rocky outcrops and forests to The Balconies look out, another stunning geological formation. Tonight we sleep in dormitory style accommodation in the heart of the Grampians.

DAY 2 We get up for breakfast before hiking (2 hours) the Grampians. The day continues with the visit the Brambuk Cultural Centre where you will get chance to learn about the local Aboriginal history, before departing this wondrous place. For lunch we stop somewhere truly spectacular: the Tower Hill Reserve, home to wetlands, a dormant volcano, a lake and abundant wildlife: you might get the chance to spot koalas and emus!

The magnificent Great Ocean Road beckons! We stop at several extraordinary rock formations along the Shipwreck Coast, such as the Bay of Martyrs, London Bridge and Loch Ard Gorge. For many, the most amazing sight is the famed Twelve Apostles. This spectacular collection of limestone stacks is best appreciated at sunset from the boardwalk. You will also have the opportunity to view them aboard a helicopter (extra cost). Tonight we stay in dormitory style accommodation on the Great Ocean Road.







This itinerary is the Adelaide to Melbourne trip. Melbourne to Adelaide itinerary is similar but in reverse, arrives in Adelaide on Day 3 at approximately 7pm.

4 Days / 3 Nights

Departs on the first Friday of every month (and the third between December and March)

Pickups from Adelaide City from 6:45am and North Adelaide at 7:20am

Returns to Adelaide & North Adelaide at approximately 6.30pm **DAY I** Quickly escaping the city, we head north into the magnificent Flinders Ranges, the starting point for our outback desert adventure. Passing through charming country towns like Quorn and Hawker the scenery gradually changes to the legendary landscapes of the oldest continent on earth. We walk the trail at Arakaroo Rock to reach an aboriginal art site on the east side of Wilpena Pound. At the lovely Parachilna Gorge, with its rock pools, red cliffs and creek beds, you'll probably spot kangaroos, emus and, maybe a rare Yellow-footed Rock Wallaby. Tonight we will stay at Angorichina, in the magnificent Parachilna Gorge.

DAY 2 Now, it's time to really hit the Outback! From Maree, with a rich history of camel trains, we head along the unsealed Oodnadatta Track. We also follow the old Ghan Railway, with its crumbling bridges and long-abandoned settlements, and traverse the bottom of Lake Eyre. Usually a giant salt pan that you can walk, dance or cartwheel on. About once every seven years when it fills with water Lake Eyre transforms into Australia's largest lake, where fish and birdlife gather to celebrate! We stop at Coward Springs for a relaxing, all-natural spa with its consistently warm water. At William Creek, South Australia's smallest town with an official population of just 10 people and their pets, we enjoy a few drinks and chat to locals at the iconic pub built in 1887. This night will be spent counting desert stars while snuggled inside a swag.

DAY 3 We start the day following an isolated track through Anna Creek, the world's largest working cattle station – at about 32,500 square kilometres, it's bigger than Israel. Coober Pedy is the Opal Capital of the World and set in a landscape that looks like the moon. On a tour of an underground mine and Opal Mining Museum you'll learn about the history of the town. There'll be time to explore this remarkable town above and below the ground; try your luck fossicking or "noodling" for opals or just browse one of the many opal shops. A highlight for some is visiting Josephine's Kangaroo Orphanage, where you can meet the rescued kangaroos and baby joeys and admire (or buy) Aboriginal art and didgeridoos. Tonight we sleep like the locals do – underground, in bunkhouse accommodation.

DAY 4 After breakfast, we leave early for the trip back to Adelaide through the ever-changing landscapes of the great Australian Outback. There are many opportunities to stop for photos, and we usually have lunch on the foreshore of Port Augusta at the tip of the Spencer Gulf, before arriving into Adelaide at approximately 6:30pm.

DAY I Quickly escaping the city, we head north into the magnificent Flinders Ranges, the starting point for our outback desert adventure. We walk the trail at Arakaroo Rock to reach an aboriginal art site on the east side of Wilpena Pound. At the lovely Parachilna Gorge, with its rock pools, red cliffs and creek beds, you'll probably spot kangaroos, emus and, maybe a rare Yellow-footed Rock Wallaby. Tonight we will stay at Angorichina, in the magnificent Parachilna Gorge.

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DAY 3 We start the day following an isolated track through Anna Creek, the world's largest working cattle station at about 32,500 square kilometres, it's bigger than Israel. Coober Pedy is the Opal Capital of the World and set in a landscape that looks like the moon. On a tour of an underground mine and Opal Mining Museum you'll learn about the history of the town. There'll be time to explore this remarkable town above and below the ground; try your luck fossicking or "noodling" for opals or just browse one of the many opal shops. A highlight for some is visiting Josephine's Kangaroo Orphanage, where you can meet the rescued kangaroos and baby joeys and admire (or buy) Aboriginal art and didgeridoos. Tonight we sleep like the locals do - underground, in bunkhouse accommodation.

DAY 4 It's a big day driving up the Stuart Highway, with several pit stops en route. Our mission today is to reach Uluru – nothing will prepare you for the sight of The Rock. We quickly set up camp before learning about the local aboriginal History at the Uluru Kata Tjuta Aboriginal Cultural Centre, soon after we'll be experiencing our first awe-inspiring Ulunu sunset, taking time to absorb the beauty and majesty of this place.

DAY 5 We start the day at dawn taking a walk around the base of Uluru (3 ½ hours). Hiking through acacia woodlands and grassy clay pans, you'll spot wildlife at waterholes, marvel at The Rock's geological wonders and learn more about Aboriginal interpretations from your Culturally Accredited Groovy Guide. We relax back at our campground or join one of our Adrenalin Plus Options before witnessing another brilliant Uluru sunset.

DAY 6 After devouring yet another scrumptious breakfast we'll experience a glorious sunrise over Kata Tjuta, before we hike to lookouts around Kata Tjuta (The Olgas) and visit the majestic Valley of the Winds with its ancient rock formations and extraordinary views. The hikes here can be challenging at times, with steep sections and duration of about 3 1/2 hours. After the walk we hit the road to reach Watarrka National Park (Kings Canyon) where we'll camp for the night.

DAY 7 Our last day is spent exploring Watarrka (Kings Canyon), where you'll need to stop to admire and photograph the massive sandstone walls, vast canyon floor and stunning gorges. On the Canyon Rim Walk (3-4 hours), you'll experience the beautiful Garden of Eden and learn more about the local Aboriginal culture. After lunch we begin our journey into Alice Springs and arrive at approximately 6:30pm.

DAY I We start our adventure travelling through the vineyards of the Clare Valley wine region, but soon enough we're heading into the rugged Outback through the historic town of Melrose, gateway to the Flinders Ranges. We enjoy an easy stroll through the awesome Alligator Gorge, which is sometimes bursting with wild flowers. We'll then settle in the heart of the Southern Flinders Ranges for the night.

DAY 2 Along the way to Coober Pedy – the Opal Capital of the World – you'll notice the incredible changing landscapes. Wildlife, such as kangaroos, emus and eagles, will scatter as road trains thunder across a landscape that resembles Mars or the Moon. On a tour of an underground mine and Opal Mining Museum you'll learn about the history of Coober Pedy. A highlight for some is visiting Josephine's Kangaroo Orphanage, where you can meet the rescued kangaroos and baby joeys and admire (or buy) Aboriginal art and didgeridoos. Tonight we sleep like the locals do – underground, in bunkhouse accommodation.

DAY 3 It's a big day driving up the Stuart Highway, with several pit stops en route. Our mission today is to reach Ulunu — nothing will prepare you for the sight of The Rock. We quickly set up camp before learning about the local aboriginal history at the Ulunu Kata Tjuta Aboriginal Cultural Centre, soon after we'll be experiencing our first awe-inspiring Ulunu sunset, taking time to absorb the beauty and majesty of this place.

DAY 4 We start the day at dawn taking an (3 ½ hour) walk around the base of Ulu<u>r</u>u. Hiking through acacia woodlands and grassy clay pans, you'll spot wildlife at waterholes, marvel at The Rock's geological wonders and learn more about Aboriginal interpretations from your Culturally Accredited Groovy Guide. We relax back at our campground or join one of our Adrenalin Plus Options before witnessing another brilliant Ulu<u>r</u>u sunset.

DAY 5 After devouring yet another scrumptious breakfast we'll experience a glorious sunrise over Kata Tjuta, before we hike to lookouts around Kata Tjuta (The Olgas) and visit the majestic Valley of the Winds with its ancient rock formations and extraordinary views. The hikes here can be challenging at times, with steep sections and duration of about 3 ½ hours. After the walk we hit the road to reach Watarrka National Park (Kings Canyon) where we'll camp for the night.

DAY 6 Our last day is spent exploring Watarrka (Kings Canyon), where you'll need to stop to admire and photograph the massive sandstone walls, vast canyon floor and stunning gorges. On the Canyon Rim Walk (3-4 hours), you'll experience the beautiful Garden of Eden and learn more about the local Aboriginal culture. After lunch we begin our journey into Alice Springs and arrive at approximately 6:30pm.



DAY 2 Today we set out for Uluru, nothing will prepare you for the sight of The Rock – it's awesome! Firstly, we learn about the region's indigenous history at the Uluru Kata Tjuta Aboriginal Cultural Centre before taking an easy walk around the base of Uluru and learn more about Aboriginal interpretations from your Culturally Accredited Groovy Guide. There's no better way to finish the day than watching the amazing sunset over Uluru, before snuggling inside your swag under the star-studded desert sky.

DAY 3 After an early breakfast, we'll head to Kata Tjuta for a sumptuous sunrise and visit the majestic Valley of the Winds, with its ancient rock formations and extraordinary views. The hikes here can be challenging at times, with steep sections and duration of about 3 ½ hours. We relax back at our campground, take a dip in the swimming pool or join one of our Adrenalin Plus options before witnessing another spectacular Uluru sunset.

DAY 4 Along the way to Coober Pedy – the Opal Capital of the World – you'll notice the incredible change of scenery. We'll get the chance to visit the opal Mine museum where you'll learn the History of the city. The highlight for some is visiting Josephine's Kangaroo Orphanage, where you can meet the rescued kangaroos and baby joeys and admire (or buy) Aboriginal art and didgeridoos. Soon after you get the chance to eat some of the most amazing pizza in the outback before spending the night in a bunkhouse sleeping the way the locals do – underground!

DAY 5 After breakfast, we journey south into the foothills of the magnificent Flinders Ranges. We stop at Lake Hart to appreciate this wonderful salt lake. We'll reach Port Augusta for lunch before driving to Willmington for the night. Tonight we'll sleep among the red gum trees at Stony Creek Bush Camp.

DAY 6 We enjoy a morning walk through the stunning Alligator Gorge, which is sometimes bursting with wild flowers and amazing wildlife: you might get the chance to spot kangaroos or wallabies. We enjoy our last lunch together, before stopping at a vineyard in the renowned Clare Valley to sample some local wines.




