Discover the soldiers and military tactics that decided the territorial fate of the Pennsylvania frontier in 1763.

Bushy Run Battlefield is the site of a battle between forces led by Col. Henry Bouquet, en route to relieve the besieged Fort Pitt, and several allied Native American nations who ambushed them in hopes to repel British and colonial advances into the frontier. The park offers a visitor center, a gift shop, battlefield tours and more than three miles of picturesque walking trails situated on over 200 acres in rural Westmoreland County. As the only registered Native American battlefield in Pennsylvania, Bushy Run Battlefield offers a unique look at the clash of cultures that were crucial to moving America towards independence.



Hours of Operation

OPEN Visitor Center: May through October, Wednesday through Saturday, 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. Sundays, noon -5:00 p.m.
Park: Open year-round.
