Market Area

In the 19th century, the elegant Georgian sandstone buildings that line Salamanca Place and face Hobart's waterfront were used for warehousing whale oil, grain, timber and imported goods.

Today, as one of Hobart's most dynamic entertainment precincts, visitors and locals flock to Salamanca Place for its shops, restaurants, bars and cafes.

Each Saturday, Salamanca Place comes alive when the area hosts Hobart's famous Salamanca Market, the most visited attraction in Tasmania and one of Australia's largest and most vibrant outdoor markets.

Market Traders

First held on 22 January 1972, Salamanca Market has grown from a dozen informal traders to encompass nearly 300 licensed traders. Today, Salamanca Market showcases a variety of fine art, crafts, jewellery, fresh food and friendly locals. The market's numerous Tasmanian producers and designers make Salamanca Market memorable and unique – from freshly picked organic fruits and vegetables to handmade jewellery, to world-renowned woodwork made from distinctive Tasmanian timbers like Huon Pine and Blackheart Sassafras

Casual Market Traders

Salamanca Market showcases a diverse selection of registered casual traders each week. Whilst their stalls can be located throughout the Market, the majority of casual traders are located at the west end of Salamanca Place, opposite St David's Park. Casual traders are not individually listed on this map.

Getting to Salamanca Market

On Saturdays, Salamanca Market is closed to traffic from **5:00am** to **6:00pm**. Visitors are encouraged to use public transport, walk, cycle or access a City of Hobart car park situated nearby Salamanca Market.
