A big hello from Ouseburn Farm. We're not your typical farm though – we're a 'working farm', as well as a training and education centre, right in the heart of Newcastle's inner city.

We offer a unique educational experience for children of all ages (from early years to 16+) in an environment where they can learn about farm animals, as well as the flora and fauna of the North East. This is a chance for them to learn about important things like recycling and sustainability – it's a great way to be introduced to the sights, sounds and smells of the countryside.

We've got loads of animals (big and small) that pupils can find out lots of fascinating facts about. There are grazing animals like sheep and cows in our meadows, and on our farmyard there's piggies, chickens, ducks and more. Inside, they can get up close and personal with small, furry animals and reptiles.

We have a well-stocked garden and orchard to explore. Plus, our shop sells trinkets and gifts (a great place to spend pocket money), as well as special animal food if you'd like to give our residents a treat.



Covering your curriculum

Our workshops cover the four pillars of the Ofsted inspection framework and can be adapted to fit in with your curriculum.

The benefits of outdoor learning:

- Children develop their curiosity, confidence and creativity
- Meets the Foundation Stage learning objectives and develops practical life skills
- Many children thrive in this kind of environment compared to traditional classroom learning
- Physical, social and health benefits for children who are increasingly leading 'indoor lives'

Our workshops

Our workshops last around an hour and you have a choice of two per visit. We can take up to **60 children** in total and split them into two workshops. Choose from either a morning (10am-12noon) or an afternoon session (1pm-3pm). We have a number of set workshops that have proven to be popular in the past, or we can be **flexible** and run a **bespoke** workshop to meet your needs.



Green fingers

- Make paper plant pots
- Sow seeds to take back to school or home
- Composting
- The importance of water
- Polytunnels



Recycling in the garden

- · Search for worms in the soil
- Hunt for recycled materials
- Examine our compost bins
- · Find out why trees drop their leaves



Ouseburn nature trail (seasonal)

- Explore the flora and fauna of the Ouseburn valley and our orchard
- Wildflower hunt
- Spot butterflies in the valley
- Try pond-dipping what living creatures can be found?



Farm animals

- Feed the chickens check for eggs
- Tour the grazing fields
- Take the animals from the farm to the fields
- Find out about types of 'feed'
- Take a tour of the farmyard animals – feed them and learn more about them



Small petting animals

- Meet some of our more exotic animals such as geckos, giant snails, tree fogs, tortoises, ferrets and hamsters
- Have a petting session with our fluffy bunny rabbits and guinea pigs



Mini-beasts in the garden

- Hunt the mini-beasts
- Examine habitats
- · Build your own 'bug hotel'



WWII - Dig for Victory! (2hr session)

- Recreate being evacuees to the countryside with responsibilities like tending to the animals
- Learn the importance of having your own allotment during wartime
