By road from Forres: From the clock tower (Tolbooth) in the centre of Forres take the B9010 to Dallas through both parts of Rafford Village. Tulloch Lodges is sign-posted on the left 600 m beyond the second part of the village.

A nature lover's paradise with a beautiful lochan and seclusion provided by 28 acres of silver birch and pine forest. A perfect place to spot red squirrel, roe deer and a wide variety of birds such as woodpecker and heron around the lodges and woodland trails.











Eight spacious, self catering lodges, in three different styles, all fully equipped yet blending peacefully into a loch side or woodland setting.

- Type A Lodges (4 star) have three bedrooms, two bathrooms (1 en-suite), open plan living space and sun lounge.
- Type B lodges (4 star) have three bedrooms, one large bathroom, open plan living space and sun lounge. Disabled access category 2.
- Type C lodge (3 star) have two bedrooms one bathroom and open plan living space









The Lodges

The spacious, relaxing lodges are designed to blend into the natural surroundings and have been finished to a high standard. Graded excellent, 4 stars quality by Visit Scotland, the four 3 bedroom lodges have sun-rooms overlooking the water, perfect for unwinding. The four 2 bedroom lodges have a grading of 3 stars and enjoy a peaceful woodland setting nearby.

Tullochwood Lodges has been trading for over 25 years and has built up a reputation for providing excellent quality accommodation, which has resulted in many return visits from satisfied customers.

The Grounds

The lochan, barbeque and safe play area have been established for the enjoyment of guests - maintaining a balance between natural habitat for wildlife and an enjoyable outdoors experience for guests and families. There is a wooden playhouse – 'Little Tulloch' which is a favourite meeting place for toddlers. The outdoor court for badminton or tennis is also a popular spot for adults and children.

For the sports enthusiast, there is cycling, sailing, tennis and fishing, which can be rented locally. Moray is a well-known golfing area and there are a large number of golf courses locally ranging from the Championship links at Nairn to less challenging but equally scenic courses.

The Surrounding Area

Situated in Moray, four miles from the town of Forres and a ten minute drive from the golden beaches of the temperate Moray Firth. The coastal towns of Nairn, Findhorn and Lossiemouth and forest trails at Culbin and Roseisle are a short distance away. A perfect base to explore Inverness and the Highlands, the Moray Coast and Speyside.

Wildlife enthusiasts will enjoy Dolphin watching trips on the Moray Firth and spotting grey seals relaxing on the Moray beaches. Located on the 'Malt Whisky Trail', the lodges are surrounded by distilleries offering guests endless opportunities to sample world famous malt whiskies.

Some of Scotland's best historical sites are within close proximity, including Brodie and Cawdor Castles and Culloden Battlefield and Visitor Centre.
