

EXPERIENCE

Though it's a short trip from the heart of Albuquerque to the heights of the aerial tramway, the distance can also be measured in the drama of an 11.000 square mile panoramic view. From the base to the top of 10,378 foot Sandia Peak, time and terrain seem to move in harmony as passengers lift from the desert floor, above canyons and lush forests, to the mountain top.
